
FUTURE DATES

The Parts of a Parent Reader



Reminders for GOOD READERS

Preview

Look over the title, the cover, the pictures, and some of the content to see what it is about and how it is organized.

Infer

Decide what the author means by using clues, details, and facts to help you understand characters and events.

Picture It

Draw pictures in your mind as you read. Visualize the characters, the setting, and the action.

Ask Questions

Ask, "who," "what," "where,"
"when," "why," and "how"
questions to decide if what you
are reading makes sense.

Predict

As you read, think about what has already happened, and guess what will happen next. Read to find out if you are right.

Make Connections

Compare what you have mad to what you know about people, events, and the world around you.

Summarize

Use the details, the order of events, and the characters to draw conclusions about what you have read.

Review and Respond

Look back at what you have read. Discuss or write about your impressions and what you have learned. Explain your responses.



Questions to ask your child while reading fiction text

Who is the main character?

What was the setting?

What was the problem in the story and how was it solved?

What do you predict will happen next in the story?

Why do you think the author chose the title for the story?

Do you like the title of the story? Why or why not?


Can you think of a different title for the story?

Which character from the story would you choose to be your friend? Why?

What part of the story was the most exciting? Why?

Did you like the end? Why or why not?
