

What is the tallest tower you can build from 6 sheets of newspaper. Can your tower support the weight of a small beanie toy?



Parental controls are the names for a group of settings that put you in control of what content your child can see. Combined with privacy settings these can help you protect your children from the things they shouldn't see or experience online.

How to set up parental controls

Many parents are put off using controls and settings as they think they will be difficult to set up, or complicated to use. By following these step by steps guides, it can make it simple and straightforward.

As a parent you have some decisions to make about how you want your child to engage online and on social media and what measures you want to put in place to help protect them:

Setting up their device

Whatever device you choose to buy your child, there are free controls you can use to stop your child from purchasing and using certain apps, seeing certain content, or limiting what they can share with others, like their location for example.
