Dear Parents/Carers

Despite the cold and wet weather this week, the children have been in great form, energetic and enthusiastic as ever. Our pupil leadership team (comprising of pupils from year 6) led the assembly on Wednesday and focused on developing playground facilities to promote fitness and wellbeing. They discussed ideas on how we can further develop both KS1 and KS2 areas and noted suggestions from other pupils. Year 5 are currently working on persuasive letters to present their views to the Governors. Our aim is to use pupil voice to inform use of the sports grant and agree a project to take place in the summer term. The Government allocates Good Shepherd a sports grant for the sole use of promoting fitness in young people. We are currently working with the children to agree designs to improve the outdoor facilities to encourage all pupils to engage in activities in a creative and sporting way.

The pupil leadership team will meet with the Governors before half term to present the project to them. The presentation and plans for the project will be displayed in school and be available for you to view in the next few weeks. Pupil's wellbeing and fitness continues to be a big part of our school curriculum and I am delighted with the number of pupils who have booked onto extra curricular sports and non sporting clubs which started this week.

WHY READ 20 MINUTES AT HOME?

	Student A	Student B
	Read <mark>20 minutes</mark> five night of every week	Reads only 4 minutes a nightor not at all!!
Step 1: Multiply minutes a night X 5 times each week	20 min. X 5 times a week =100 minutes/week	4 minutes X 5 times a week= 20 minutes/week
Step 2: Multiple minutes a week X 4 weeks each month	Reads 400 minutes a month	Reads 80 minutes a month

If a child starts reading for 20 minutes per night in Nursery, by the time they reach the end of Year 6, Student A will have read for the equivalent of 60 school days, Student B will have read for 12 school days. Who do you think will be more successful?

WANT TO BE A BETTER READER? SIMPLY READ.

Help your child become a better READER.

Questions to ask your child while reading fiction text.

-Who is the main character?

- -What is the setting in the story? Does the setting change?
- -What was the problem in the story and how was it solved?
- -Did the character change during the story? How? -How are you like the main character? How are you different?
- -What do you predict will happen next in the story?
 -Why do you think the author chose this title for the story?
- -Do you like the title of the story? Why or why not?
 -Can you think of a different title for the story?
- -Which character from the story would you choose to be your friend? Why?
- -Which part of the story was the most exciting? Why?
 -Did you like the end of the story? Why or why not?
- -Which parts in the story could really happen? Which
