Dear Parents/Carers

Thank you to everyone who attended the International evening last term and particularly to those of you who remained until the end of the evening to support all pupils performing. The children were great and my thanks go to all the staff who worked hard to prepare the children. Do look through the photographs of the evening!

We will be changing the format next year and are considering hosting two afternoon performances – one for EYFS/KS1 and the second for KS2. Details will be shared next year.

This term is always busy and important. Advent is a key time for us as a Catholic School and the focus will be on preparing for Christ's birth in a spiritual and meaningful way to help children understand the true meaning of Christmas. To support this we will be launching our School Christmas appeal in the next few weeks so please do keep an eye out for details. The children are actively involved in making the decision regarding the charity we will be supporting as it is important for pupils to have this input. I know you will be very supportive.

<u>School Uniform</u>

Please remember that all pupils must now be in their full winter uniform and wear a dark, warm waterproof coat to school. Boots are not allowed in school but pupils may wear them travelling to and from school if weather conditions are severe. Please also note that hairstyles must be smart and signs and symbols shaved into hair cuts is not acceptable. Long hair should be tied back for health and safety reasons, particularly during P.E.

Please ensure that your child brings in their full P.E. Kit and that all items are clearly named. They may take it home at the end of the day, however, it needs to be in school every day. A number of children have been bringing in key rings and other attachments to clip onto their school bags which has caused problems as they can easily break or get lost. Therefore, I ask that you please do not attach any items to school bags or coats. Many thanks.

Prescribed medication in school

If your child needs to be given prescribed medication during the school day, please see a member of the Senior Leadership team or myself to complete the appropriate paper work. We will not be able to administer any medication unless this is done. If your child has an asthma inhaler or an Epipen, please do check with the class teacher to ensure items are in date. The colder months can be difficult for some children with Asthma and it is important that you regularly liaise with staff to keep the school up to date on current advice for your child.

Contact numbers

Unfortunately, considerable time is spent by the ladies in the office trying to get through to some parents as a result of out of date information or people not responding to messages left. It is a key aspect of safeguarding to have up to date information so please do inform the office of any changes. Should we not be able to contact you, we will contact the emergency contact on file.

<u>Birthday treats</u>

Do remember that you are welcome to bring in fruit for the class or donate a book/books to the class library if you wish to give your child's class a birthday treat. Individual party bags, or any confectionary/food is not allowed owing to many of our pupils having allergies. So please do not distribute them on school premises.
