

**Dear Parents/Carers** 

May is the month of Mary so please make time to say the Rosary with your child and talk to them about the importance of saying the Rosary and the meaning of each mystery of the Rosary. The Chaplaincy Team meet daily at lunchtime to say a decade of the Rosary and we ask you to try and do the same at home.

#### **Teaching and Learning Review**

Mr Sorsby visited Good Shepherd on Tuesday, 24th April to carry out a teaching and learning review with senior leaders. He observed lessons, looked at current data for progress and attainment in all year groups and met with pupils.

This review is part of a termly process undertaken by all schools within the Catholic Umbrella Trust. I am delighted to say that his feedback was very positive and he feels the school is in a very strong position. He was understandably very complimentary of the pupils who are undoubtedly our greatest strength. Their behaviour was exemplary and their attitude to learning outstanding. Mr Sorsby stated that the actions undertaken by Leadership and implemented by all staff to address the dip in Key stage 2 maths results last year are having impact and contributing to improved standards across the school. My thanks to all the staff for their hard work and commitment to ensure good outcomes and to you parents who work with us. Further details will be shared with you once I receive the full report.

Mrs Geal asked me to pass on her thanks for all the good wishes on the birth of her son, Bobby. She hopes to be able to visit soon and I will notify you of the date to give you a chance to meet the youngest member of our school family.


#### The Eucharist
