Advice For Parents on Filtering

There are four main places you can find parental controls, and it can help to set up a combination of these:

Internet provider: you can set up filters to help block access to inappropriate content on any device that connects to your home WiFi

Mobile operator: filters are often automatically set up on mobile contracts, but you can double-check with your provider

Devices: many devices have parental control settings, for example, to help restrict spending in apps or disable location functions

Online services: sites like BBC iPlayer and YouTube have parental control settings to help restrict access to inappropriate content

How to set up filters on your home internet to help prevent age inappropriate content being accessed on devices in your home.

The 4 big internet providers in the UK – BT, Sky, TalkTalk and Virgin Media - provide their customers with **free parental controls** which can be activated at any time. They have come together to produce these helpful video guides to help you to download and set-up the controls offered by your provider. We know that children, particularly younger children, can be bothered by things they see online, and filters can be a helpful tool in reducing the chances of coming across something upsetting.

Remember that filtering is only part of the solution

No filter or parental controls tool is 100% effective, and many of the risks that young people face online are because of their own and other's behaviour. It is therefore *important to talk to your children about staying safe online* and make sure they know that they can

turn to you if they get into any difficulty
