
TEACHING & LEARNING UPDATE

CROSS CURRICULAR LINKS

- Pupils experience a wide curriculum and have the chance to apply their basic skills (English & maths) in other subjects.
- R.E, History, Geography, Art, Music, Design and Technology,
 Computing & PE are all taught to ensure pupils are well informed and balanced
- Pupils are encouraged to develop their talents and speaking and listening skills to enable them to be articulate and confident
- * All subjects are assessed and tracked in line with school policy.
- * Increased opportunities to engage in out of school activities— Quiz competitions, sports and music events, swimming lessons for all KS2 pupils, workshops for each subject to develop skills and reasoning.


R.E. PASTORAL CARE

- We embed the school's Christian ethos in every day life - discussion, pupil voice, pupil, parent and governor engagement
- * Pupil led liturgies/Collective worship
- Pupil led groups—peer mediators, Pupil Leadership team, school council, digital leaders
- * Strong links between home and school open door policy, class /school newsletters, topic webs
- Parents encouraged to come in and work with their child each morning before school.

standards in teaching and learning this year?



MATHS

- Increased activities for pupils to apply reasoning skills and explain their thinking in real life contexts. Made maths very cross curricular (science, design & technology, computing)
- * Enterprise curriculum—pupils form their own business and raise money for charity
- Revised our calculation policy to support strong teaching and learning across the school
- * More opportunities for practical work to support skills
- Analysed pupils answers in tests and class work to identify strengths and weaknesses
- Used information to inform teachers' planning and teaching so that all pupils make progress
- * Staff involved in Maths Hub groups to share ideas
- Pupils are more reflective and able to explain their reasoning, identifying errors and ways to improve
- Challenge for all pupils through use of a range of activities maths investigations, open ended questions.


ENGLISH

- * Further improved use of good quality texts
- More use of whole class reading sessions to give all children experience of reading and discussing a variety of texts
- * Increased booster /class teaching sessions to meet the needs of all pupils
- Use of higher level questioning to encourage explanation and reasoning
- Increased opportunities for pupils to read and write outside English lessons - cross curricular subjects (History, Science, Geography, R.E, Current Affairs, Art, Design & Technology and P.E)
- Increased focus on modelling skills (both staff and pupils)
- * Enterprise Curriculum—pupils set up their own businesses to raise money for charity

STRIVING FOR EXCELLENCE TOGETHER AS ONE OFSTED UPDATE

Good Shepherd is currently in the cycle for forthcoming inspections. A Section 8 is a one day inspection and a Section 5 is for more than one day. The focus for all inspections is safeguarding and the quality of education provided for all pupils together with the strength of leadership and governance. Most schools receive a Section 8 (short inspection) and if necessary this may covert to a Section 5 (more than one day) for a variety of reasons based on strengths and areas of development.
