Hopefully one and all had a safe and enjoyable Easter school holiday.

In terms of our Catholic Faith, Easter is by no means just one day.

Eastertide, the season, lasts for seven weeks (50 days).

It extends from Easter Sunday night up to the Descent of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost.

('Pentecost' is a numeral - the Greek word for 50.)

In fact, Eastertide is seen as one long day. This applies especially to the Easter Octave – the 8 – day period from Easter Sunday.

This reminds us that God is always TODAY – no past or future. His name is "I AM", as revealed to Moses.

This further encourages us to strive, as best

we can, to live in the present moment. (It is not easy to forget the past, or to leave the future alone).



Yet, the present moment is where God is, passing in the gentle breeze of our lives.
