This school week ends on ALL SOULS' DAY (November 2<sup>nd</sup>).

It is very closely linked with the day before which is ALL SAINTS' DAY.

Heaven is the destiny God has always intended for each of us. To be there is to be a saint.

Just as the angels are arrayed in ranks, so there are degrees or extents of saintliness.
