
## Keeping safe

I know that I have put this in my newsletter a few times already but please do not stop on the yellow zigzags outside the school.

Yellow zig zag lines outside schools are enforced legally by the local council, which will use camera cars, CCTV or parking wardens to issue a penalty charge notice.

Stopping even for a few seconds to allow your children to get out of the car blocks the view for pedestrians and oncoming traffic and could easily cause a serious accident. There was an incident this week of a young child running into the road close to a car which had stopped on the zigzags when the parent was on the phone.

For the safety of everyone's children, please don't stop directly outside the school and please keep hold of young children's hands.

### Free event

There is a Croydon Courts Open Day (consisting of the Crown Court and County Courts) next Saturday 11<sup>th</sup> May 10:30am – 2:30pm held at The Law Courts Altyre Road, Croydon, CR9 5AB (a couple of minutes from East Croydon tram stop).

The Courts will be open to the general public and the objective of the open day is to raise public awareness of the role they play within the administration of justice and to show how HMCTS (Her Majesty's Court & Tribunal Service) is committed to providing an effective service within society.

The open day will provide everyone with an opportunity to see 'behind the scenes', as many aspects of the building and services are not normally open to the public. You will be able to see the cells and prisoner vehicles as well as find out what it is like to be a Judge and Magistrate.

They will be running some short mock trials which aim to reflect Civil and Family work as well as the Criminal work of the Crown Courts.

There is a family walk at Selsdon Wood this Saturday (4th).
