Fr Con's Reflection

The 40 days of Lent (beginning with Ash Wednesday) present a great opportunity to engage with the Bible.

The Bible, of course, represents a series of books.

A great place to start would be the Psalms, of which there are 150.

Religious communities (e.g. monks and nuns) would cover all of these in a week, by meeting together in chapel on 5 or 6 occasions in every 24-hour period.

Obviously we cannot match that.

Instead we could request from Google, a grid with the numbers 1 to 150, for us to print off. Then, pen or pencil in hand and with eyes closed, we would point to a number.

That can then be our Psalm of the Day. After a first reading follow it immediately with a second. It will not disappoint – in no time, we will be praying with Sacred Scripture.
