## Fr Con's Reflection

Last evening, Wednesday 25<sup>th</sup> September, our church staged the annual Deanery Thanksgiving Mass for teachers and all school support staff.

So many people carry out crucial roles in the day-to-day running of a school: - the secretarial staff; the Business Manager; the site manager; the kitchen staff; the team of cleaners. They do so, without being situated in the classroom.

They are crucial for the smooth running of the school. Therefore they are greatly appreciated and most worthy of an expression of gratitude.

At the above Mass, we had a total of 8 priests and a Deacon - all from the Croydon Deanery.

The theme of that Mass is that we all have a role to play in influencing the young for good, and to be and achieve their best.

They will remember all adults, irrespective of role, who positively helped them. What is taught is obviously vital – but there is also what is caught – the importance of good example.

## Safeguarding

The school has been given the opportunity to take part in a project that will run jointly between schools and the Metropolitan Police.

Operation Encompass is the reporting to schools, prior to the start of the next school day, when a child or young person has been exposed to, or involved in, any domestic incident.

Operation Encompass will ensure that members of the school staff, known as the Dedicated Safeguarding Leads (Mrs Day and Mrs Downing), are trained to allow them to liaise with the police. This information is shared, in confidence, to ensure that the school is able to make provision for possible difficulties experienced by children, or their families, who have been involved in, or exposed to, a domestic abuse incident.

We are keen to offer the best support possible to all our pupils and we believe this will be extremely beneficial for all those involved.
