It is often said that a week is a long time in Politics.



It is certainly a long time in Church Worship.

Last Sunday was the solemn feast of CHRIST THE KING, with its focus upon his 2nd coming, in glory upon the clouds of heaven.

This coming Sunday is the First Sunday of Advent – the holy season of preparation for another yearly celebration of this 1st coming, as the saviour Baby of Bethlehem (in the space of one week, we have moved from the final Sunday of Year B, to the opening Sunday of Year C – in the 3 year cycle)

In these "4 weeks" of the Holy season of Advent, our individual challenge each day will be to hold uppermost, in our hearts and minds, the true meaning of Christmas.

Each day, we could, for example, read just a few verses from the Infancy Narratives at the beginning of Luke's Gospel – and then reflect upon those verses, for a few minutes, in a personal prayerful silence.
