First Aid Workshops

All classes had a special first aid workshop today as basic first aid is such an important skill to learn.

The children learnt about Dr's ABC

D—Danger

R—Response

S—Shout (for help)

A—Airway

B—Breathing

C—Circulation

They also looked at a first aid box to see what it should contain, learnt how to check for a pulse and to check if someone was breathing.

"We learned how to calm people down and save people in a dangerous situation."

"I found this workshop really useful because I was able to understand how to give first aid."

"She taught us the equipment she has in her first aid pack. She had special scissors which can cut through clothes and bandages."
