Tuesday of this week, we had the Leavers' Mass in the school hall (July 19th).



Mass is known as the Eucharist – from the Greek word of THANKSGIVING.

THANKSGIVING is the 3rd word of the four that make up the abbreviations A.C.T.S. This shows us what the order of our prayer(s) should be: A for Adoration; C for Confession (or Contrition); T for THANKSGIVING; S for Supplication (asking God to supply our needs).

As we end this school year, we give thanks to God for His Protection and Providence during it; we send our best wishes to Year 6 as they approach their secondary education; we send our best wishes to staff members who are leaving.
