We would like to introduce you to Pickatale for schools and families.

Pickatale is a free reading platform offering hundreds of educational, fiction and nonfiction e-books.

All books are levelled to ensure that children are reading the appropriate books for their reading level. There are various books that have quizzes at the end and there is the option to turn on audio and narration to support reading practice, which is perfect for less confident readers.

The Pickatale School app can be downloaded from Google Play and the AppStore. Pupils will be given a unique access ID and form by their teacher to access their free account. Pupils can access the app on-demand, anytime and anywhere on the following devices: Android Phones, Android Tablets, Chromebooks, iPhones and iPads.

#### **Fr Con's Reflection**

Wednesday was the feast of the great king/saint, Edward the Confessor. He became king in 1042 and died in early January 1066. To the historian(s) of his day, he was proclaimed as a true 'father' to the people of his kingdom. He was never happier than when giving active aid to the poor. His title 'Confessor' points to his confession (or professing) of his faith. He pioneered and funded the building of Westminster Abbey. His death came one week after its opening. He is buried behind it's main altar.

What we can learn from him is that an active love of God impels one to active charitable works. God rewarded him with the completion of the great Westminster Abbey project, before He called him from this life to his Heavenly reward.
