A relative of Mr Duffy, the first headteacher of Good Shepherd, sent in a wonderful box of school photographs to us this week from the 1950s and 1960s.

Amongst the school history box was this newspaper article from the Croydon Advertiser on 3rd February 1956 after the official opening of the school, although the school had opened in the September of 1955.

There was also a staff photograph taken in the carpark with Fr Con's house in the background and no fences or gates to be seen. Interesting how school security has changed over the last 66 years!

Fr Con's Reflection

Tuesday was All Souls' Day. It is the day for prayerful remembrance of the deceased—in the month that is especially dedicated to all the departed—it follows directly upon the opening day of November (All Saints' Day).

All Souls' Day points us straightaway to the doctrine of Purgatory. Souls there are eternally saved but need to take into themselves more light.
