## Healthy School Street from 23 January

Dunley Drive & Walker Close will become a Pedestrian and Cycle Zone only between the hours of 8- 9.30am and 2 - 4pm from Monday to Friday, during school term time only.

The scheme will be enforced using Automatic Number Plate Recognition (ANPR) cameras, which will only capture registration numbers of vehicles entering the Healthy School Street during operational hours and issue fines.

## Fr Con's Reflection

Last Sunday (8th January) was the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord. It concluded the Christmas season.



On the following day, we entered 'ORDINARY TIME' in the Church's calendar.

That Feast brings home to us the significance of our own baptism—the day when we entered the Family of God.

This month, in Tuesday assemblies, we will be examining Baptism. This Tuesday, in answer to the question 'What was different about Jesus' Baptism?' one child gave an interesting and quite humorous answer i.e. 'He did not have a sponsor.' When the question was repeated, another child gave the answer that was being looked for i.e. 'He was aged about 30.'

Baptism removes from the individual soul the mark of Original Sin passed down from Adam and Eve.

In our final prayer at that assembly we chose the 'HAIL MARY'. The children prayed it very devoutly. She is the highest honour of the human race, in that she had been preserved by God, totally free of the mark of Original Sin. As tutor to the young Jesus, she is the ideal person to approach in prayer for the children's success in all school activities.
