Mental Health Week

We have encouraged the children to make sure that they go outside every day of half term to help support their wellbeing.

10 things to do outside—one for every day of half term!

- 1. Go for a walk around your local area
- Sit outside and count how many birds you see
- 3. Collect some twigs and leaves and make a picture using them
- 4. Look up at the clouds and watch them moving across the sky with the wind
- Make a parachute for a small toy using different materials, like cloth, plastic or paper, and see which material works best
- 6. Fill a plastic container with water and collect things from around the home to see if they float or sink
- 7. Using a paintbrush and a pot of water, create some outdoor water art
- 8. Go on a 'spot the creature' adventure.
 Go to Hutchinson's Bank Nature
 Reserve and make a note of all the birds,
 butterflies and minibeasts you see
- 9. Go along the pavement on a scooter until your heart beats faster
- 10. Go to the park to play on the equipment and run around

On that day, may we adults commit to praying the Joyful Mysteries of the Holy Rosary for the deceased, bereaved and injured of these earthquakes - asking Our Blessed Lady's intercession on their behalf.

At the same time, our pupils should be encouraged, on that day, to pray a "mini-Rosary" (one 'Our Father; 3 x 'Hail, Mary'; 'Glory be...') to Our Lady of Lourdes, asking that children be safely delivered from under the widespread rubble.
