Fr Con's Reflection

In this week just about to end, there have been 2 very significant days in the church calendar.



September 14th (Wednesday) was the feast of the Triumph of the Cross (also known as the Exaltation of the Cross). The day this year, when the coffin of our late Queen Elizabeth II began its period of lying in state in Westminster Hall.

The Cross of Jesus was Triumph, by virtue of this glorious Resurrection within 3 days of death. The Cross is the centrepiece of our Christian Faith. The Resurrection is the central tenet of that Faith.

Queen Elizabeth II was always very aware of these truths. Her Christmas Day message annually would always find room for mention of the true meaning of that feast and season.

September 15th (Thursday) was memorial of Our Lady of Sorrows. She, more than anyone understands the pain of bereavement for, within about 30 years of Bethlehem manger, the dead Body of her Son is taken down from the Cross and placed in her lap.

May she bring consolation to our new monarch, King Charles III, and to all the members of the Royal Family.
