These are designed to teach pupils how to stay safe from abuse, without giving explicit information or even using the term "sexual abuse". The lessons are fully ageappropriate. Sporting News


Some of our children in Year 1 joined the children from Applegarth last week for some football training led by Chelsea Football Club.
