Responsibility

We have been looking at all the different ways we help children at Good Shepherd to show responsible attitudes towards society. Helping children develop responsibility gives them confidence in dealing with unexpected situations.

We thought you would like to hear how we do this:

Reward acts of responsibility: We reward children when they demonstrate acts of responsibility through praise, stickers and certificates. This shows them that responsible behaviour is a really good attitude to have and children are quick to grasp habits that they see in others on a daily basis.

Get children involved: We get children involved in different activities such as helping to give out books, collect up resources or pass messages to different members of staff. This helps to build children's confidence.

Support Honesty: When children make mistakes, we ask them the reason for their behaviour and encourage them to tell the truth. We also have reflection sheets. All this makes them feel valued and leads them towards the path of responsibility.

Year 3 Educational Visit

The Year 3 class had a wonderful trip to the Natural History Museum this week linked to their Geography topic on volcanoes. They were able to demonstrate their knowledge of the causes and effects of volcanoes and the ways people protect themselves from volcanoes.
