Fr Con's Reflection

This opening week of October 2023 has no shortage of religious "themes". This month of the Rosary opened last Sunday; this month's 1st Sunday always being "Rosary Sunday" Monday (2nd October) was the Memorial of the Holy Guardian Angels. Wednesday (4th October) was the Memorial of one of the best -loved saints- Francis of Assisi. Saturday of this week (7th October) will be the Memorial of Our Lady of the Rosary.

Into this somewhat maze of themes, there was a wonderfully powerful remark made on the BBC 10pm News on Sunday 1st October. The context was that day's prayer gathering in Central Croydon. It mentioned Elianne (the 15-year-old girl murdered there on Wednesday 27th September), and Brandon (murdered here in New Addington on Tuesday 12th September).

The remark in question was from Elianne's pastor. It was "ELIANNE REALLY LOVED JESUS!"

(Truly, that is what religion and faith is all about).
