Household Support Fund

After receiving funding from government, the council has now launched a fund to support residents who are struggling to buy food, heat their home or purchase essentials such as fridge/freezer, oven/microwave, a bed or bedding.

Residents can refer themselves or a school can refer on a parent/carers' behalf, with permission. Residents must be able to demonstrate that they do not have funds to cover the items being requested and will need to evidence any income and provide a bank statement.

Full details and application form can be found at the link below. Applications for food/ fuel will be processed within 48 hours and household items, within 4 weeks.

Fr Con's Reflection

We are in the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity.



January, concluding 25th, which is the feast of the conversion of St Paul (formally Saul).

Sch unity is so desired by the heart of Jesus. In John's Gospel (chapter 17, verses 21-23), he says to God the Father:

"MAY THEY ALL BE ONE. FATHER, MAY THEY BE ONE IN US, AS YOU ARE IN ME AND I AM IN YOU, SO THAT THE WORLD MAY BELIEVE IT WAS YOU WHO SENT ME. I HAVE GIVEN THEM THE GLORY YOU GAVE TO ME, THAT THEY MAY BE ONE AS WE ARE ONE. WITH ME IN THEM AND YOU IN ME, MAY THEY BE SO COMPLETELY ONE THAT THE WORLD WILL REALISE THAT IT WAS YOU WHO SENT ME, AND THAT I HAVE LOVED THEM AS MUCH AS YOU LOVED ME."

We see how wonderful is the end of this extract: Jesus loves us with exactly the same degree of love as God the Father loves Him, his only Begotten Son.

Perhaps, on Tuesday 25th January, we could pray to St Paul, asking him to intercede for a lasting Christian unity across the world.
