

### Safer Internet Day 9th February

Fake news is where false information is presented as genuine news. Disinformation and conspiracy theories, for example about coronavirus, are often widely shared on social media. These stories could be worrying for your child. Help your child spot fake news by asking themselves:

What is the source? Is it a reputable news source, and are mainstream news outlets, such as the BBC, reporting it too?

When was it published? Check the date an article was published, as sometimes old stories are shared on social media. This could be an accident, or it might be to make it look like something happened recently.

Have you seen anything similar elsewhere? What happens if you search for it on Google or check it using a fact-checking website like Full Fact?

Do the pictures look real? Images might have been edited. They might also be unrelated images that have been used with the story.

# Why might this have been created?

Could someone be trying to provoke a specific reaction or get you to click a link?

Encourage them to **read beyond the headline** too. Many people share stories
having just read the headline, then
discover the actual story is quite different.

Point them to the government's SHARE checklist (<a href="https://sharechecklist.gov.uk/">https://sharechecklist.gov.uk/</a>) and advice from Childline (<a href="https://bit.ly/3oYfsgd">https://bit.ly/3oYfsgd</a>) too.
