Reading at home every day for 20 minutes improves children's general knowledge and improves their communication skills. But did you know that it also reduces stress levels?



Fr Con's Reflection

Thursday of this school week, 22nd February, was the Feast of the Chair of St Peter.



This celebrates Peter as the first Pope - the Rock on which Jesus would build His Church. Jesus had changed his name from Simon to Peter, since 'Peter' means 'Rock' in both Latin and Greek.

This is the one Feast Peter has to himself in the Church's Calendar. (He has a joint Feast with St Paul on 29th June, each year).

Peter was not perfect. He would have been the very first to admit this of himself. He was rather impetuous. For example, he thought he could walk on water like Jesus. When the going got really tough, he would deny Jesus three times as Jesus predicted he would!

Yet, Jesus saw leadership qualities in Peter, which the Holy Spirit could refine as necessary.

Through it all, Peter truly loved Jesus e.g. weeping bitterly after disowning Him. This Lent, we can take encouragement from Peter's weaknesses.
