This school week ends for the pupils on Thursday, with the staff having an Inset day of Friday.



Friday, 11th February is the 'Feast' of Our Lady of Lourdes. It is always designated "WORLD DAY OF PRAYER FOR THE SICK."

At Lourdes in 1858, the 14-year-old girl Bernadette (Soubirous) had 18 visions of Our Beloved Lady who 'revealed herself as the Immaculate Conception.

She asked Bernadette to drink from the water below the rock of Massabielle.

This water was proved to have miraculous properties – therefore Lourdes has become a most famous place of pilgrimage, especially for the sick.

Bernadette herself had much illness in her own life. In 1854, four years before the apparitions, she had contracted cholera in the epidemic. She died on April 16th 1879, aged 35 and in great agony. She had become a nun at Nevers, and her mortal remains are incorrupt in the St. Gildard chapel there.

Mrs Day, our headteacher, has been to Lourdes many times – part of an organisation aiding the sick. She knows well the chapel that Our Lady had asked Bernadette to inform the church authorities that she wanted build.
