Fr Con's Reflection

On Wednesday of last week (21st February) Canon Gerard Bradley visited our school. (A few weeks ago, Fr Con had telephoned his office, expecting to speak with his Permanent Secretary, Jacques Lambert, concerning Confirmation. It was Canon Gerard himself who answered, and expressed a wish to commence with visits to the schools in his sub-area of the Southwark Archdiocese. Canon Gerard is Episcopal Vicar for the South-West area of our diocese - this means he is, in effect, carrying out many of the duties of an Area Bishop).

So, his visit to us was arranged informally. He arrived at the start of the school day. (Fr Con could not join until about 10.15am due to Mass at 9.15am).

Fr. Con testifies that Canon Gerard was very impressed with what he witnessed in the various classrooms - how very engaged the children were and how well the staff kept them engaged. Fr. Con endorses this as he too saw this for himself.

That day was a Lenten day of Reflection across the school.

It is to the great credit of the staff, and thereby of the children too, that so strong an evidence of engagement with the Christian Faith was, and is, on display.
