Pastoral Lead

Below is a message from Miss Baxter about her work at Good Shepherd. We are fortunate that Miss Baxter works full time at school and so she is able to support a large number of children.

Hello.....I want to re-introduce myself, as although I have been at Good Shepherd for nearly a year, I haven't had to the chance to meet many of you due to restrictions. My name is Miss Baxter and I am Pastoral Lead at Good Shepherd. My role is mainly focused on working with the children, by supporting them to ensure they are happy and feeling settled in school. The children I work with are normally referred to me from the teacher or the child themselves may come and speak to me. I either do 1-2-1 with children or small group work and work closely alongside the class teacher to support children. We will be starting a new project in the next few weeks called ELSA. ELSA stands for Emotional Literacy Support Assistant and the aim is to remove the barriers to learning and to have happy children in school and at home. When we know which children will be taking part in this, I will be sending a letter and an information leaflet home. If you have any questions about anything, please get in touch. Children's NHS Eye Tests

Eye tests are particularly important during childhood because it means potential problems with vision can be spotted early. This improves the chances of successful treatment, if it is needed.

All children under 16 years old are entitled to one free eye check every two years, or more often, if recommended by their optician. In addition, they can also get an optical voucher to help pay for their glasses,

which means many glasses are completely free for children.

Don't worry if your child is not sure of their letters as opticians use pictures instead with very young children.
