### School admissions

Please encourage anyone who has a child ready to start in either our Nursery class or in our Reception class in September 2021 that they must apply for a place during the next few weeks. Although the closing date is in January, I strongly recommend that an application form is handed in before the school breaks up for Christmas.

If a parent/carer attended Mass in a particular parish (or parishes) prior to 18th March 2020 when the obligation to attend Sunday Mass was temporarily ceased, then they will be considered to have attended Mass in that parish (or parishes) regularly since that time. This will remain the case until the Sunday obligation is reintroduced by the Bishops.

The governors have drafted an amendment to the admissions criteria for September 2022. They would like to consult with the parents on the amendments and any responses should be sent to the school office by Tuesday 8th December marked 'For the attention of the Governors'.

The main change in the draft policy is to give priority to children who are one of the following:

- Catholic children
- A member of the Eastern Orthodox Church
- A member Churches Together in England
- Part of the Evangelical Alliance
- Belonging to other Christian churches

Priority will be given to these children over those of other faiths or of no faith.

The full document is on the school website under the 'About our School' tab and the new additions are marked in red font.



## Fr Con's Reflection

This coming Sunday is the 30<sup>th</sup> Sunday in the Church's Year – a year that will end on 22<sup>nd</sup> November with the solemn feast of CHRIST THE KING.

This coming Sunday's Gospel passage is very short. Jesus is asked by he Pharisees: "Which is the greatest commandment of the Law?"

His answer is in 2 parts: primarily one must love God with all of one's heart, soul and mind. Secondly, one must love one's neighbour as oneself.

From Jesus' answer, we can quite properly detect that we are called to have also a healthy and positive love of self, because we are created in God's image and likeness - which means we were created "holy".

Love of neighbour, respect for others – these are certainly called for from us in a situation of pandemic and, indeed, at all times.

Hopefully everyone connected with our school will have a happy and safe ½ term week, despite the necessary COVID-19 restrictions.
