Class Teacher Job Description

- To support and to contribute to the Catholic ethos of the school
- To support a positive school ethos through excellent classroom and behaviour management
- To plan, prepare and deliver learning experiences appropriate to the needs of learners in line with the school curriculum. Where it is appropriate to do so, planning should take place in collaboration with other staff
- To implement all agreed school policies and procedures
- To regularly assess the attainment and progress of children within the class and implement strategies to improve outcomes
- To ensure the classroom is a stimulating learning environment with well-presented displays linked to relevant class work
- To be a role model and encourage good relationships with children, parents and colleagues
- To carry out all duties required of a teacher as specified in the current Teachers' Pay and Conditions document
- To carry out specified actions required by the priorities of the School Development Plan
- To contribute to the annual programme of school self-evaluation
- To undertake continual professional development in order to enhance your role as a teacher in the school
- To take part in agreed procedures for your performance management in the school
- To lead a subject (or work alongside a subject leader if an NQT)
- To work effectively and professionally with all staff members
- To contribute to the wider life of the school
- To carry out additional duties which may be reasonably requested by the Headteacher
