Good Shepherd PE and Sport Premium 2020-2021

All schools are given an allocation of money each year which is calculated on the number of pupils in Years 1 to 6. Good Shepherd will receive £17,840 for 2020-2021. Schools must use the funding to make additional and sustainable improvements to the quality of PE and sport they offer to encourage the development of healthy, active lifestyles.

There are five key indicators which schools should expect to see improvement across:

- 1. The engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity
- 2. The profile of PE and sport being raised across the school as a tool for whole-school improvement
- 3. Increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport
- 4. Broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils
- 5. Increased participation in competitive sport

"A high-quality physical education curriculum inspires all pupils to succeed and excel in competitive sport and other physically demanding activities. It should provide opportunities for pupils to become physically confident in a way which supports their health and fitness. Opportunities to compete in sport and other activities build character and help to embed values such as fairness and respect."
