Year 2: St Lucia Spring 1

Prime question: Where is St Lucia on the world map?

Subsidiary questions:

- What is an island?
- How would we get to St Lucia?
- Guess how long a flight would take from the nearest international airport.
- Look at a map of the Caribbean. Can the children find St Lucia?
- What do you think St Lucia might be like?
- Have any children been to the Caribbean?
